Primary Pupil Voice – collecting views

How can we get primary aged pupils to give us feedback about their classroom experiences?

The following questions have been used successfully in a number of primary schools to find about what gifted and/or talented pupils think about their learning:

1. What are their thoughts on what makes a good teacher?
2. What are their thoughts on what makes a good lesson?
3. What helps them to produce a really good piece of work of which they are proud?
4. What is it about this piece of work that makes them proud of it?
5. When do they find their work most exciting and challenging?
6. What is it that makes this work challenging?
7. What really motivates them to work at their best?
8. If they have struggled with any work, why was this?
9. How could this have been prevented?
10. What do they think about being bright? – advantages? disadvantages?

These questions could be used variously:

- with individual G&T pupils during one-to-one interviews;
- provided as a written questionnaire or survey;
- with specific focus groups in open discussion;
- as homework to be considered with the pupil's parents/carers.

1. Which subjects are most enjoyable? Why?
2. What is your preferred teaching style? e.g. Lectures, problems set with personal help, practical work etc.
3. Has the work been challenging enough? Was any Year better than another?
4. Which activities are boring?
5. Is homework of real value to you?
6. Is it best to work on your own, in pairs, in small groups, as a class, in a group of the teacher's choosing, in a group of your own choosing?
7. Which factors motivate you to do well? e.g. Your parents, yourself, your ambitions, your teachers, getting better test marks than others.
8. Which factors impede your progress?
9. Is there sufficient space for you to use your own ideas, imagination, creativity?
10. Is the atmosphere in school conducive to high achievement?
